CLOTHING

- 7 pair underwear
- 7 pair socks
- 7 Shirts
- 7 Shorts
- 1-2 pair of pants/leggings
- 2 one-piece bathing suits
- Warm sweater, jacket, or sweatshirt
- Warm pajamas
- Bathrobe or towel wrap
- 1 raincoat

SHOES

- 2 pair of tennis shoes
- 1 pair of closed-toe waterproof shoes/boots
- Flip flops for shower shoes
- Chacos/Texas/or other water shoes that strap to feet for sliding rock (crocs are not a good option).

PLEASE DO NOT BRING

- Nice clothing items
- Personal Towels (camp provides towels)
- Any electronics (Cell Phones, Go Pros, iPods, MP3s, Kindles, smart watches, fitness trackers Digital Cameras)
- Valuables of any sort (i.e. Jewelry, fancy makeup/skincare products)
- Twinkly lights
- Food or Gum

One Week Junior Campers:

Items you bring to camp could get lost, stained, or ruined.
Pack accordingly and leave your name brands at home!
Label everything with first and last names.

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Floss
- Medications (filled by pharmacy in required Blister Packs and given to medical staff at check-in)
- Shampoo, Conditioner, and Soap (Anti-bacterial is recommended)
- Deodorant and lotion
- Brush, detangling spray, and hairbands
- Sunscreen and Chapstick
- Pump Bug Spray
- Washcloths/loofa (towels provided)
- Shower Caddy to keep items in
- Laundry Bag

MISCELLANEOUS

- Twin Sheets and Blanket(s)
- Pillow and 2 Pillow Cases
- Flashlight/headlamp w/ batteries
- Stationary and stamps, pens
- 2 Water Bottles
- Books
- Hat
- Backpack

OPTIONAL

- Dressup Costumes/Silly Outfits
- Sunglasses/swim goggles
- “Crazy Creek Chair” (recommended and can be ordered through camp)
- Battery Powered Clip on fan for bunk

HELPFUL HINTS FOR PACKING AT ILLAHEE

- We strongly encourage you to leave expensive brand-name items at home.
- If your daughter brings a mattress cover or egg crate for her bed, she **MUST BRING IT HOME**.
- Medication, including OTC, vitamins, and supplements, should be easily accessible in your bag so that **it can be given to our medical staff during check-in**. It must be blister-packed by a pharmacist and prescribed by a doctor.
- Shoes/boots should have been worn before camp and broken in to prevent blisters.
- Please label your camper's clothing and other items! Things are easily misplaced at camp.
- If your daughter wants to bring specific items for her activities, she can, but this is **NOT REQUIRED** as we provide all needed items. (Equestrian Boots/helmet, Lacrosse Stick, Bike Helmet, Etc.)
- When you think about costumes, think outside the box! Tutus are great, feather boas are not. Accessories (glasses, hats, jewelry), halloween costume pieces, and colorful spandex are great additions. If you don't have these items, no need to buy them - creativity abounds at camp.
- Mail is slow. You may leave pre-written letters on Opening Day for us to disperse. Also, it helps to pre-address envelopes for your daughter, especially if they are younger.
- We recommend that some of your clothing be synthetic rather than cotton to help dry out quicker.
- The climate at camp is cooler in the mornings/evenings and warm in the afternoons. We get rain showers most days. Be sure to pack the warmer clothing items and rain gear listed.
